			Ensure compliance with Smoke-Free IL Act - public places and places of employment must be completely smoke-free inside and within 15 feet from entrances, exits, windows that open and ventilation intakes; signage posted at entrances & exits; no vaping or e-cigarette use in food & drink prep area, dishwashing area, and storage area; no smoking within building structure.

		FYI	HAZARD ANALYSIS CRITICAL CONTROL POINT	
			- Keep potentially hazardous food requiring time/temperature controls for safety out of the temperature danger zone of 41° F – 135° F [use a clean and sanitized metal-stem thermometer to monitor food package temperatures]	
			- Wash hands frequently at hand sink, especially before using gloves – double hand washing after using the restroom	
			- Chlorine: 50-100 ppm in tub, immersion for 10 seconds; 75° F 100-200 ppm also for swabbing, moist-wipe cloth, spray bottle; 75° F (keep bottles labeled and properly stored)	
			- Recommend documenting temperatures of refrigeration units, freezing units, food package temperatures, sanitizer concentrations, etc., on a log sheet	
			- Make sure all containers of food are properly labeled w/ <u>name</u> and <u>date & time</u> of opening of package, in addition to the <u>date & time</u> when the food was placed into the container; discard TCS food under refrigeration after a maximum of 7 days	
			- Store cleaning supplies, toxic items, personal care items, etc., on bottom shelves below food, utensils, single-service items, equipment, etc., to prevent possible contamination	
			- Make sure exterior packaged ice freezer (Home City Ice) is kept locked at all times except when in use for food security & safety
