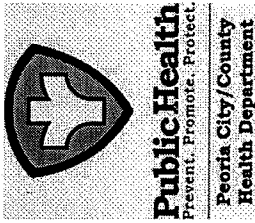

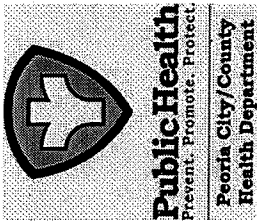

### **Data and Strategic Questions Review**

Based on the Strategic Issues identified on the June 13, 2016 meeting, additional data was provided to the committee. Data points specifically addressed gaps and needs around Substance Abuse, Mental Health, Suicide, and Access. (See Attached BH Crosswalk)

### **Goal and Objective Identification**

The committee was presented a dashboard on the Goals, Objectives, and Strategies. The dashboard defined the following:

Goal: High level idea

Objective: Using data identified through the CHNA and a national-standard; SMART (Specific, Measureable, Achievable, Relevant, Time-Related)

Strategy: Evidence/theory-based interventions and best practices.

Task: Individualized plans and policies that support the strategies.

Current data measures were reviewed with Healthy People 2020 to determine goals and objectives. The committee focused on two overarching goals: Mental Health and Substance Abuse (with the understanding that Access was strategy and Suicide an objective)

### **Strategy Options**

Review of County Health Rankings and The Community Guide was completed. Committee members were asked to begin researching both sites on best strategies to incorporate.
